INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Bilingual preferred; command of any of the following languages: Spanish, Creole, Swahili, Arabic, Dari, Pashto, Russian, Ukrainian
- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Currently enrolled in an undergraduate program, graduate program
- Must commit to a minimum of 10 -15 hours per week per term
- To allow for appropriate supervision and guidance, hours must be fulfilled during the week (Monday - Friday) and in an hours block that takes place during the regular business hours of 8a - 5p
- Term length varies (based on educational institution). Average term is 9 weeks
- Possess and maintain a valid driver's license and auto insurance
- Pass a Level II AHCA Background screening (LSS paid)
- Applicants with, but not limited to, the following academic backgrounds are welcome: social work, TESOL, international studies, non-profit management
- Cross-cultural experience preferred
- Working knowledge of computers/software such as MS Word, Excel, Outlook
- Must be able to communicate orally and in writing
- Assertive, completes projects independently with minimum guidance
- Ability to work with people from various cultural, religious and social backgrounds

SAMPLE DUTIES OVER THE TERM

- Assist case managers in conducting client assessments and data entry
- Conduct file reviews to ensure compliance with grants
- Prepare client files for new arrivals and newly enrolled clients
- Set up apartments for new arrivals
- Receive and process donations
- Keep inventory housewares and furniture items
- Chaperone youth (ages 15+) on field trips
- Create and lead workshops available for refugee clients
- Provide interpretation and/or translation of materials relevant to program activities, plans or appointments (if applicable)
- Conduct community outreach
- Duties may be amended as required by internship agreement with educational institution
